Want to know which play has Londoners buzzing, what exhibition to check out in New York or the top spots to eat in Sydney? There's a new handy, and most importantly, trustworthy, guide - brought to you by the clever folks at Air Mail (a digital weekly newsletter and website led by former Vanity Fair co-editor Graydon Carter) - called the Arts Intel Report. It was created, in their words, as the searchable international cultural guidebook built "by people and for people who don't trust guidebooks." The editors select essential events to highlight around the world, from ballets to rock concerts, art shows to nightclub acts. On top of which there's also a nifty search function where you can type in a popular city, arts discipline and date for specific recommendations to help you plan the perfect cultural sortie. airmail.news/arts-intel -AW

BUSINESS OF TRAVEL // FLIGHT PASSES

"All you can fly" sounds like music to our ears, and flight passes could be the ticket for those who frequently travel to the same destination and want to avoid fluctuating prices.

With the Air Canada Flight Pass, travellers purchase a set number of one-way-flight credits - or an unlimited travel package - within a set geographic zone, at a fixed price. (For example, a 10-pack of Flex tickets for travel within Ontario is \$3,900.) They can book flights, with few restrictions - right up till one hour before departure. While it's an obvious benefit to business travellers, these passes also work for homesick university students, spontaneous vacationers or anyone tired of exorbitant last-minute fares.

Porter offers a similar pass, and it comes with an enticing benefit. If you buy one of the airline's larger packages of 20, 50 or 100 prepaid flights, the credits are transferable - perfect for families or groups of people who want to share the hefty expense. (20 standard tickets from Toronto to New York cost nearly \$5,000, or \$250 a flight.) -Barry Choi
